Dear Parents, Staff and Students

Chaplain

A big welcome to our new chaplain, Gary Allen, who commenced work with us on Tuesday. He will be at our school 3 days over the next 2 weeks and then 3 days every fortnight thereafter. He worked in a number of different classrooms right across our school, getting to know the students; a pretty big task for him seeing as he has to get to know students in 3 different schools.

Charlton College Cooperative

In late 2006 the Charlton College Co-operative was formed to raise some capital to facilitate the part funding of our new music room. The annual meeting of the Co-operative will be held next Wednesday evening at 7.30 pm in the staffroom at the P-12 College. All members and any intending members are asked to attend.

The Co-operative is still in need of funds. We are again asking families to purchase shares that are 10% paid up. The cooperative will not be likely to call up the extra ever. So a contribution of say \$20 will give you shares worth \$200, a contribution of \$50 will provide 500 shares and so on. Such small contributions together will mean a great deal to the school. There is an application form in this newsletter.

School Council

Among the decisions taken at this weeks School Council were:

- appointment of Tulsa Andrews as our rep on the East Wimmera Health Service community forum
- approval of the leasing of the paddock near the back trotting track to the Charlton Harness Racing Club
- approval of a small increase in some items on the canteen price list in an attempt to maintain the canteen at a break-even situation rather than a loss
- Approval of some of the drought funding as follows
 - \$100 per student for the Grade 5/6 camp
 - \$100 per student for the Grade 3/4 camp
 - Funding the travel costs for Grade 3/4 to go to the Art Gallery in Bendigo
 - Funding travel costs for the Grade 3-6 excursion to the environment festival in Wycheproof
 - \$500 towards the Charlton College textiles students excursion to Oaks Day
 - \$50 per student for Year 10 driver ed
 - \$500 towards a Year 7 end of year program
 - Reimbursement of parents travel costs for Year 11/12 students to attend open days and revision lectures

This is an attempt to significantly reduce costs for parents and to spread the funding across the school as much as possible.

Reports

These are being finalised currently and will go out to parents during the first week of next term. This will be the third set of reports using the new format and so there will be 2 sets of dots on reports comparing the progress in the last 12 months. Of course if you need to follow up any or all of these reports please contact the school and an interview can be arranged.

Congratulations to Ms Saunders and the SLC for organising the pyjama party today to raise money for the Salvation Army. The Salvation Army has supported our school wonderfully over the last 18 months and this is a small way to say thank you for all this support.

Next week is the end of a long Term 2. As usual school will finish at 2.30 pm and so buses will be running an hour early on this day.

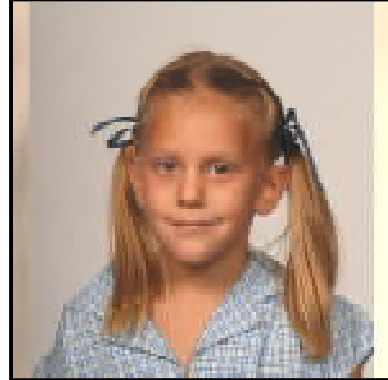

CHARLTON COLLEGE COOPERATIVE

Charlton College in late 2006 formed the Charlton College Cooperative. The major purpose of the cooperative is to enable the School Council to borrow money to assist in the construction of a new Music/Drama facility for the school. The school has been successful with a grant from the Investing in our Schools program for \$150,000 towards the project. The school council has allocated some additional money towards the room. It is likely to cost in the vicinity of \$220,000 and so the cooperative needs to raise money that can be used as the basis of a loan. The College would then budget over the following 5 - 10 years to repay the loan as part of its normal annual budgetary process. This is a one-off chance to achieve another major facility for the school.

Charlton College is therefore seeking shareholders for the cooperative. Shareholders would take up shares on a 10% paid up basis. So therefore a payment of \$20 would provide the shareholder with 200 shares worth \$1 each, a payment of \$50 would provide 500 shares and so on.

We are therefore seeking the support of the whole school community in this matter and would hope that everyone could make a small contribution to achieve a big outcome.
