ACAP (Australian College of Applied Professions) is a clinic staffed by final year Psychology/Clinical Psychology, Counselling/Psychotherapy & Social Work students on placement & offers a wide range of individual & group therapy options. Students are closely monitored & supervised by experienced senior clinicians & academics.

Services are delivered free (all fees waived in response to the pandemic) & there is currently no waiting list for therapy services to children, young people & adults.

Referrals are accepted Australia wide & services are delivered using Telehealth (Zoom). Face to face service is possible in some locations (Covid permitting). Clients & families from regional & remote areas are very welcome to access services using Telehealth.

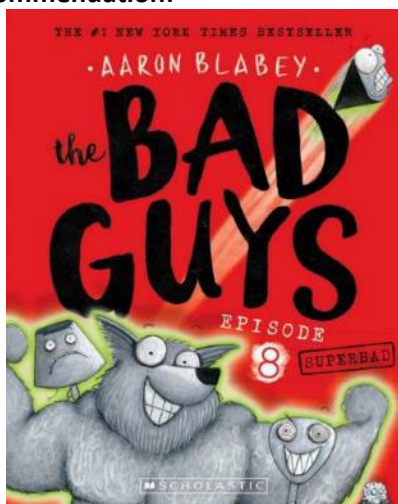
MacqLit Awards



The two MacqLit groups have passed their first level. Well done to:

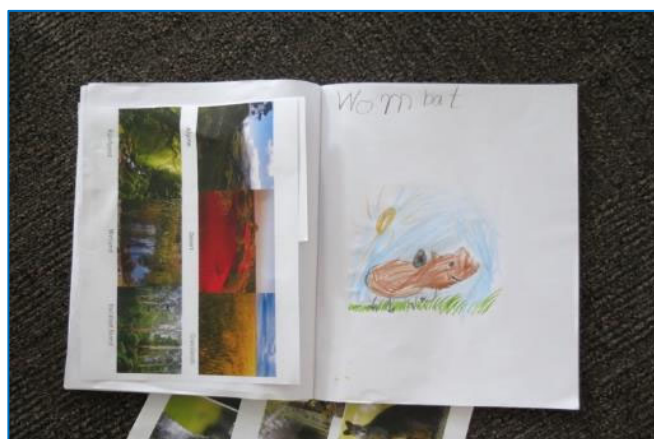

Cyber Security & Robotics Work Experience



The Australian Signals Directorate (ASD) is the national authority for information security and through its Work Experience Program offers students from Years 11-12 an opportunity to extend their knowledge and skills in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM), with a focus on information/cyber security. High achieving Year 10 Students with a strong interest in this field are also encouraged to apply and may be considered for a placement.

The ASD Work Experience Program offers a number of challenges designed to increase STEM knowledge and understanding, such as:

- python programming
- identifying security intrusions on a computer system
- identifying email compromises
- monitoring network traffic to detect exploits
- conducting forensic examinations of hard drives
- exploiting web application vulnerabilities
- learning modern encryption methods and how they are used to protect data
- performing geospatial analysis and utilising geospatial tools for imagery analysis
- engineering hardware and software solutions for security problems
- robotics programming using Arduino
- constructing electrical circuits

Interstate students are encouraged to apply – financial assistance may be available.

Placements will be held in July 2022 in Canberra.

Applications close 22 May 2022.
