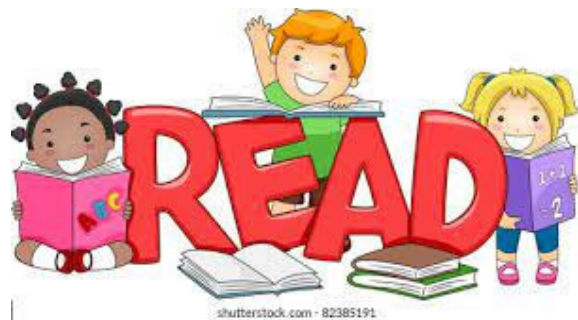
Year 1 & 2: Matey award went to Eli Cossar for making progress in all classes.
