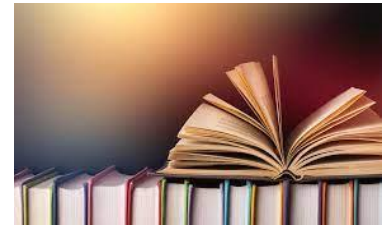

Footy Clinic

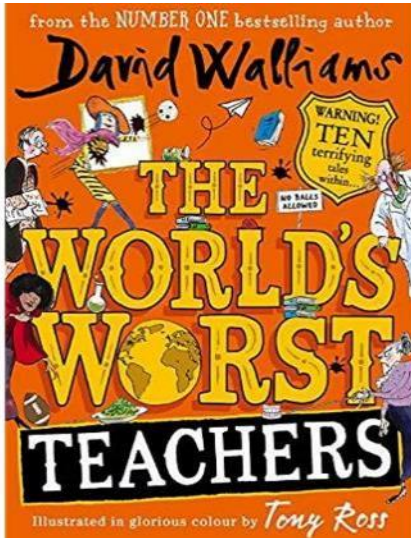
This Friday we have the first of our Footy clinics. Students are encouraged to wear their runners so they can participate comfortably.


