

Curriculum Day

Tomorrow is a curriculum day to allow staff to undertake professional development and work within learning communities. It is a pupil free day so enjoy the extended long weekend.

Around the Classrooms Insects

F-2 students participated in an 'ecolinc' online session about Insects. They learned the body parts of an insect (head, thorax, abdomen, 4 wings, six legs and two antennae) through singing the song 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes'. They discovered that the difference between a fly and a bee is the size of their antennae. Moth's wings fold back onto their body, like a pizza, whilst a butterfly's wings fold above their body, like a taco.

Opera



Last Friday F-2 students watched the entire performance of 'The Selfish Giant' by Opera Victoria. Leading up to the performance, they learned about different operatic singing voices, how the costumes and sets were designed and made, planning and rehearsing the different scenes, as well as the instruments of the orchestra.



The story was set in a beautiful spring garden owned by a giant. He barred them from playing there. A very long winter set in where nothing grew or flowered. Gradually the children found a way into the garden and spring returned. The F-2 students took part in singing a chorus of one of the songs.



This week in SAKG we learnt about Acidic and Alkaline solutions. Students looked at how a pH chart shows us exactly how acidic something is. We did an experiment using red cabbage water as an indicator by shredding cabbage and soaking it in boiling water. The cooled strained liquid has a pigment that changes colour in acidic and alkaline environment. Students measured out 3 equal amounts of the vibrant purple solution. What we discovered was when adding lemon juice to the liquid it changed to pink. Looking at the chart we could see it was highly acidic. Bicarbonate of soda added made the mixture turn blue which is neutral on the pH scale. Vinegar turned the liquid red, which was not quite as acidic as the lemon juice.

Students then ventured out to the garden to continue experimenting, this time using soil pH kits. We found that the garden beds had varied pH levels as different vegetables prefer different environments!
