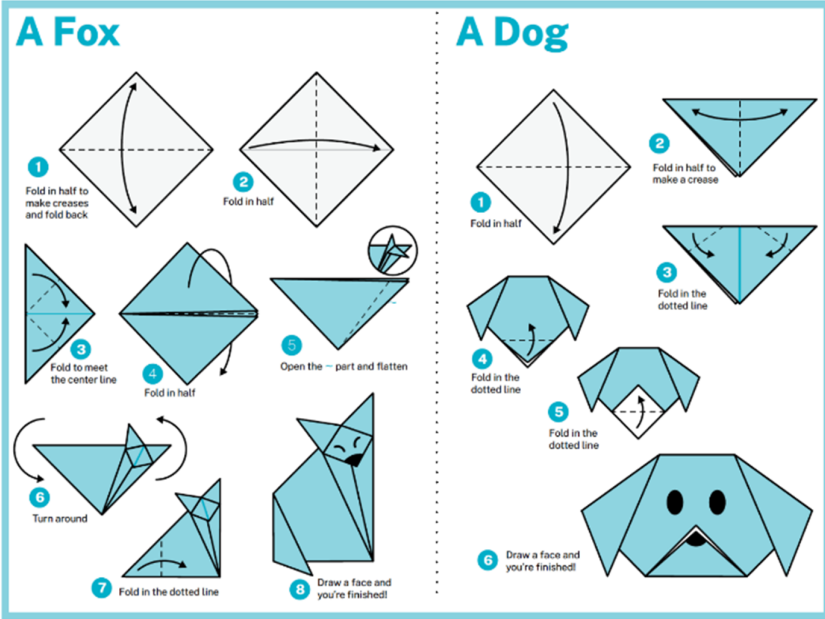
Why not try Origami a try - the Japanese art of folding paper to create different shapes, objects and animals.
