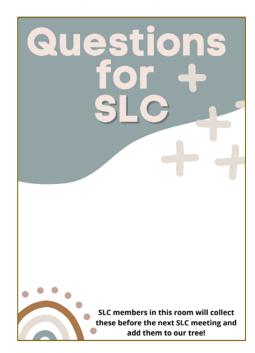

The risotto had silverbeet and roast pumpkin added to the base recipe. All the dishes were very popular, but the Orecchiette with Broccoli sauce was a clear favourite! Next term, the Years 3 and 4 students will be doing SAKG. #### **Unit 1 Exams**

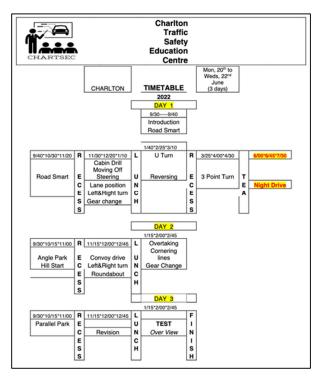

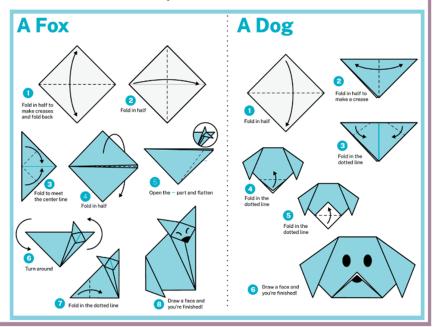
Why not try Origami a try - the Japanese art of folding paper to create different shapes, objects and animals.

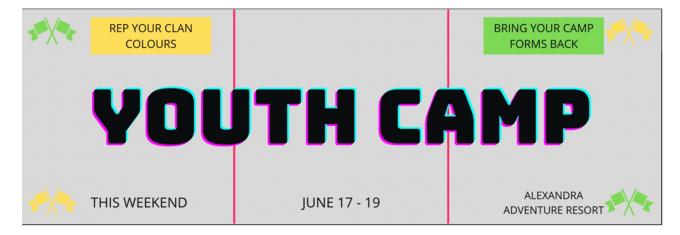
